Our Legacy

For decades, Westside Ballet, a non-profit company, has been the city's premiere pre-professional training company, with over 100 dancers ranging in age from 8–18. Yvonne Mounsey and Rosemary Valaire founded Westside School of Ballet in 1967. Shortly after, Westside Ballet of Santa Monica was formed to enhance the training of the students of Westside School of Ballet.

Yvonne Mounsey was a prima ballerina with the original New York City Ballet for 10 years where she danced under the direction of George Balanchine and Jerome Robbins. She was instrumental in the formation of the Johannesburg City Ballet in her native South Africa before starting Westside School of Ballet in 1967.

Rosemary Valaire, a soloist with The Royal Ballet from 1946 to 1954, held the prestigious Soloist Seal before immigrating to the U.S. For over three decades she taught thousands of dancers to love and excel in ballet with her classical style. In addition to her teaching, she staged ballets around the world including Sleeping Beauty and Swan Lake.


