Children's Division (ages 8-11)

- For children who have completed Ballet I or equivalent.
- Hours between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. (will vary with level); supervised care available until 5 p.m.
- Typical daily schedule includes one hour of ballet, one hour of jazz, one hour performance class (ballet or jazz), and one hour of specialty dance (folk, mime,



- choreography and musical theatre). The young dancer's day includes ballet history illustrated with ballet videos and twice-a-week craft session.
- Students will present a studio dance performance on the last day of each session.
- Leotard (Level II-pink, Level III-blue), pink tights and pink ballet shoes required; hair must be worn in a bun. Boys wear white t-shirt, black tights, white socks and black ballet shoes.
